Based on the analysis of the RTQ document uploaded which consists of queries by all the firms, we would like to bring to your kind attention and consideration a very important aspect regarding the overall evaluation criteria. The evaluation criteria has been specified as L1 (Least Cost) as against QCBS in the corrigendum. We would like to bring to your kind attention that 4 out of the 5 firms that submitted the queries had proposed QCBS evaluation. The same was acknowledged by DGR and well received during the pre-bid meeting as well.  We humbly submit that, as this is a flagship and critical project for the State which includes data policy, data privacy, data integration & beneficiary management implementation, hence technical competency, relevant experience and cutting edge approach and methodology is of paramount importance. We feel that technical score should also be given more weightage along with financial score during evaluation. The L1 evaluation criteria is restricting the evaluation of quality parameters which is the essential requirement for delivering this project, and will also restrict participation from top quality firms.  From our experience in participating in similar bids and successful delivery of similar projects across other Indian states, we can say that the evaluation criteria is generally QCBS with adequate weightage to technical competency of the firm.
